In-Home Caregiver Contracts

If you are hiring someone to take care of you, it is important to have a written caregiver contract. Consider the following points then call our office for an appointment. The team at Strohschein Law Group will help you reach your goals.



Here's why:

- Without a written agreement, you may be disqualified from Medicaid coverage if you need to go to a nursing home in the future. A contract documents the compensation and services in a format that Medicaid can understand and accept.
- Without a written agreement, you and others involved in your care may not be sure about who is responsible to maintain the needed level of care. A contract provides you with an organized schedule of care and other services that can be adjusted as your needs change.
- Without a written agreement, the person providing the care is vulnerable. A contract helps to prevent arguments and misunderstandings among others who are unable or unwilling to help out.

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
